Frequently Asked Questions

We're so glad you're interested in participating! Please read the following important logistical information carefully:

How much is it to rent a space, and what size are they?

Single spaces are \$35 and are roughly 10 feet wide by 4 feet deep.
Double spaces are \$50 and are roughly 20 feet wide by 4 feet deep.

What is the plan if it rains?

The Rain Date is the following day, Sunday, June 6th. In the event of questionable weather, you will be contacted VIA EMAIL as to revised plans by 8 pm the evening of Friday, June 4th.

How can I reserve a spot?

You MUST fill out the vendor application enclosed in this mailing or available on-line at www.cnaboston.org and submit payment via check. The CNA will not reserve a spot for you unless payment is received in advance. Please include your email address for important correspondence such as Rain Date plans.

What is set up time?

Set up time is 7:45 am. Your car must be out of the staging area by 8:45 am, as attendees are prompt and we need the street organized on time.

What is end time?

The Fair ends at 3:00 pm. You will have until 4:00 pm to clear your staging area. Our Permit does not allow us time beyond that.

Do you supply tables?

No. Vendors must supply their own tables, chairs, decoration and anything else they require.

Where can I park?

There is NO PARKING on Wellington Street, it is closed for the day for the Fair. Parking is available on surrounding side streets, as well as neighboring main streets of Columbus Ave and Mass Ave.

What kinds of things do people sell?

We have an eclectic mix of vendors, ranging from "professional" rug and antique dealers ... to artisans such as jewelers and painters ... to neighbors selling household goods. We do not have a permit for Food Sales.

What is the CNA?

The Claremont Neighborhood Association is one of the oldest and most active neighborhood associations in the South End. It is a non-profit association whose mission is to protect and strengthen the quality of life for all residents who live, rent, or own a business in the Claremont neighborhood.
